
Minutes of the Meeting of the Governing Body of Heaton St Barnabas' CE Primary School 2 April 2014



Meeting commenced at 7.20pm

Mr Grant welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced Pippa Jones, prospective foundation governor.

The main business was preceded by a training session on the Role of the Named Governor which focused on understanding the role, agreeing a strategy and protocols for carrying out the role and provision of related information and documentation. Named governors are expected to offer support and challenge to the leader of their area of responsibility and to meet them at least termly (contact by email in advance to arrange). Governors were reminded that during their visits they should not make notes or discuss individual children and should respect confidentiality at all times.

The minutes of 11/12/13 and 20/3/14 were **agreed** as correct records.

<u>20/13/14</u>: *Headteacher recruitment* Diane Smith was appointed Headteacher from 1/9/14; Mr Grant thanked everyone who contributed to the recruitment process.

49/13 Headteacher appointment

Mrs Smith will work alongside Mrs Evans on items such as the new budget, the 14/15 staffing model and the new curriculum, she will also attend SHINE meetings when possible. A teacher returns from maternity leave in May and will take over Mrs Smith's class which will give her further transition time next term.

The new curriculum has also previously been discussed in committee and further details will be brought to the full governing body meeting in May. It was **agreed** that a working party should be convened in advance of the next meeting specifically to look at the curriculum drivers. Mr Grant, Mrs Allan, Rev MacLaren and Mrs Jones volunteered for the working party (plus Mrs Burnley subject to her acceptance).

50/13 Headteacher's report

Governors questions and matters arising from the Headteacher's report: *Progress & achievement* Current Year 2 and 6 predictions for May/June 2014 are generally better than expected.

There are concerns regarding one Year 5 class - there are not enough pupils who have made expected progress which is being looked into in more detail. The poor behaviour and learning attitude of last year's Year 5 children (now in Year 6) which had been flagged up to governors previously is now much improved.

It was noted that Year 6 are predicted to miss floor targets by 1% in maths and writing, **governors asked what Ofsted's view would be of this?** Although Ofsted will look at floor targets they will also look at the level pupils came in at and their progress over time. The SIP was very impressed with the projections.

A governor asked if there is likely to be more focus on the progress of more able children, given that Ofsted are now focussing on the number of children who exceed expectations. Mrs Evans responded that school's tracking system monitors the progress of able children but also tracks individual progress from different starting points so that all those who are making more than expected progress are identified.

Budget The carry forward is likely to be £113k which will be over the 6% threshold. Possible IUB (intended use of balances) items were discussed previously but not submitted to School Finance (£10k office refurbishment, £10k revenue contribution to capital), however, due to the lower numbers on roll the school will meet the carry forward criteria for retention of overspend above the threshold.

The new budget for 14/15 is in preparation with a cautious approach until take up of places for September is confirmed.
