

## Pupil Premium Grant 2011 12 Parents' Report

Pupil Premium is allocated on the current number of children who have free school meals. From April 2012 the funding includes an allocation for children identified as having free school meals within the last six years ( now known as 'Ever 6)

### **How we spent our PPG in 2011-12**

*Support has been tailored to the needs of individuals and groups of children and has included*

Learning mentor support ( 1-1 or in small groups)

Employ a Home-School Support worker to provide support for vulnerable families and increase engagement of parents in children's learning

Homework club

Subsidising /paying for school visits

Extending pupil progress meetings to enable time to focus on the needs of vulnerable groups and groups

RM maths groups

Work to improve attendance and punctuality

#### **Training for teachers to:**

Improve the quality of teaching

Improve marking and feedback

Develop and sustain 'High-scope' methodology in Foundation Stage and KS1

### **Impact of PPG**

Monitoring of the progress of children eligible for PPG across the school has shown that this group of children have made good progress across the year. In some classes the gap between the attainment of children eligible for PPG and those not eligible has closed and some eligible children are now attaining above the class average. Attendance of many of the children had improved through the year. We have been able to make sure that the full range of visits are accessible for all children.
