

Pupil Premium Grant 2012 to 13 Parents' Report

Pupil Premium is allocated on the current number of children who have free school meals. From April 2012 the funding includes an allocation for children identified as having free school meals within the last six years (now known as 'Ever 6)

How we are spending our PPG in 2012 to 13

Support continues to be tailored to the needs of individuals and groups of children and has included

- Learning mentor support (1-1 or in small groups)
- Home-School Support worker to provide support for vulnerable families and increase engagement of parents in children's learning
- Homework club
- Subsidising /paying for school visits
- Extending pupil progress meetings to enable time to focus on the needs of vulnerable groups and groups
- RM maths groups
- Work to improve attendance and punctuality
- Restorative Practice Training for whole school
- Restorative Practice Training for children (peer mediators)
- Small group coaching (after school) in English and maths
- Workshops for parents to support children's learning
- Kindles to motivate children to read

Training for teachers to:

- Improve the quality of teaching
- Improve marking and feedback
- Develop and sustain 'High-scope' methodology in Foundation Stage and KS1
- Talk for Learning

Impact of PPG

It is too early in the year to fully measure impact this year. However, the progress and learning behaviour of the children is being monitored closely and early indications show that eligible children are making good progress.

Restorative practices were introduced in September and are already having a positive impact on attitudes to learning and relationships.
