

Here is a link that you will probably find useful. It shows the type of things that we doing in school and is the scheme that we use, Ruth Miskin – Read, write inc. It shows order of the sounds that we will do etc. Children first practice hearing the sounds. We then start to learn set 1 sounds. Children then listen to sounds and beginning to blend and segment – this is the beginning of reading and spelling.



The thumbnail shows a video player interface with the title 'Teaching sound blending' and a play button icon.


This shows you how to start blending the sounds that the children know to read simple words.




Fun games and activities are an ideal way to help children learn. These pictures will give you ideas of games you could play. Please just use the set 1 sounds in the order we look at.



Hop skotch or jumping games - please use set 1 sounds not those shown in the picture. Chalks outside can be used for lots of different fun activities. Children writing the sounds, making targets that balls can be thrown or rolled towards.



Sorting activities. – sorting objects by their initial sound.



Letters on different shapes or bottle tops to recognise, jump on, point to etc. Just use a few sounds at a time, not too many.



Target games to throw balls or rings at. Please just use set 1 sounds not the later sounds as shown on the picture.



Writing letter shapes in sand or similar with a feather or a small wand etc. is something the children enjoy.
