During the war there was an egg collection drive to send to wounded soldiers in France. By the end of 1915 over 1 million eggs had been sent. This was a way for children to help the war effort on the home front. To cheer up the soldiers children started to draw and write messages on the eggs for the soldiers to enjoy in hospital. In class we will be decorating our own hard boiled eggs to cheer up wounded soldiers we will then eat them with the parkin for a special lunch the next day.
