What is Yom Kippur?

Some people wear only white.



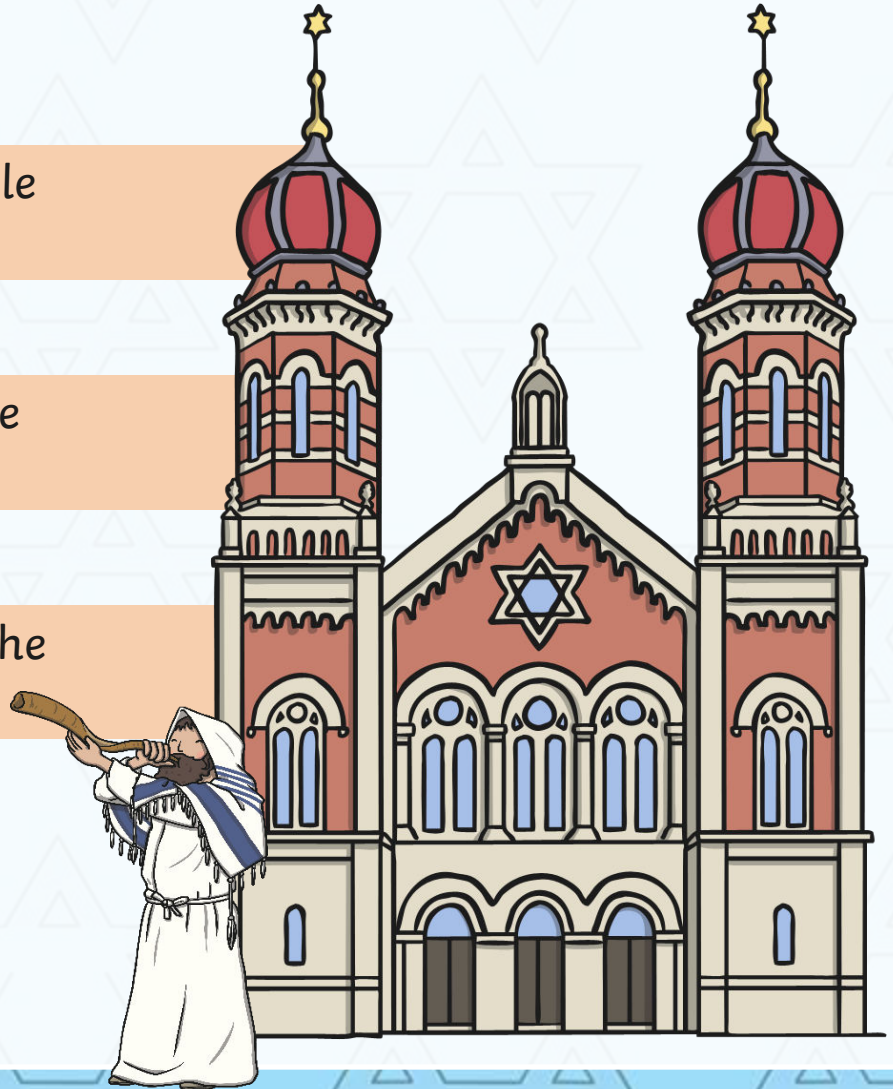
