At the Museum

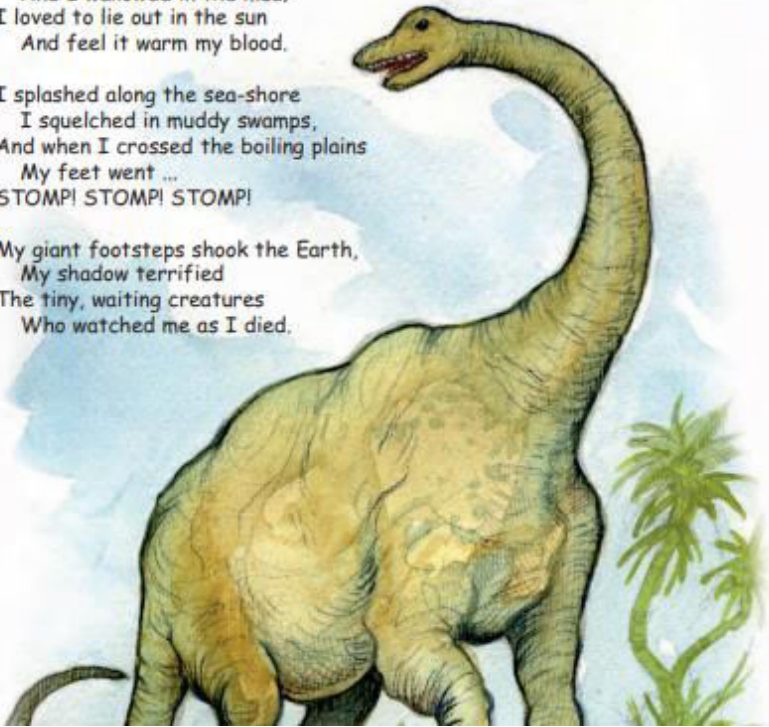
I was an ancient dinosaur

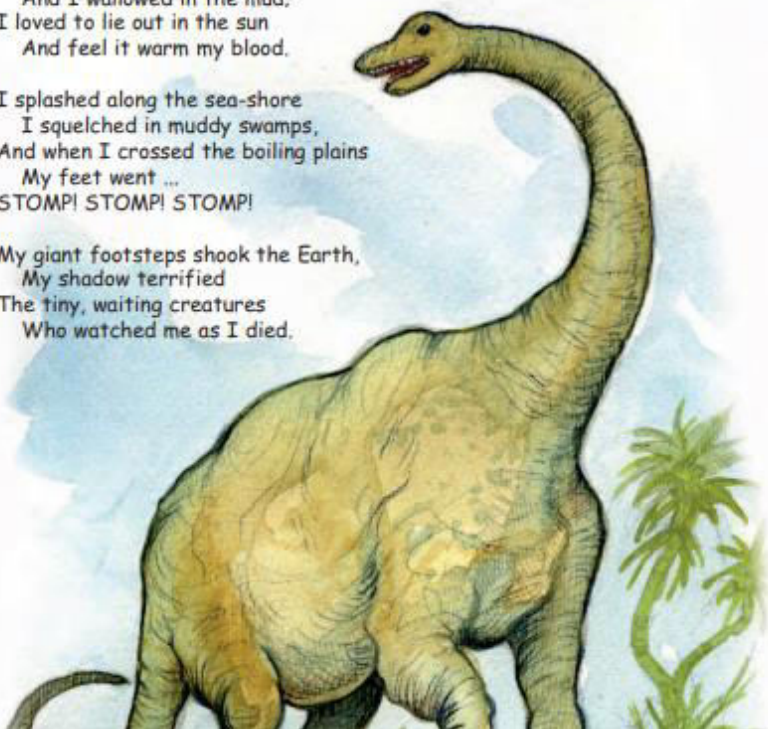
