

## wandering



#### verb

Walk or move in an unrushed, relaxed or aimless way.

'I was wandering in the woods when I tripped and found myself falling down down.'

Synonym:

stroll dawdle potter

#### verb

Trip or lose balance for a moment; almost fall.

'I could see daylight in the distance and I stumbled towards it.'

Synonyms:

stagger

## relief



#### noun

A feeling of reassurance and relaxation after feeling worried or distressed.

'To my relief, I saw someone – a girl.'

Synonym:

comfort

### stew



#### noun

A dish of meat and vegetables cooked slowly in liquid.

'They looked very strange, but they were kind to me and gave me some stew.'

#### verb

Hitting forcibly to produce sparks or fire.

'By striking flint stones together or turning a wooden drill.'

#### noun

A hard, grey rock.



'By striking flint stones together or turning a wooden drill.'

### chipped




#### verb

The act of cutting bits off a hard material to shape it.

'The flints are chipped, trimmed and sharpened, and then made into knives, spearheads and scrapers for cleaning animal skins.'

### trimmed



#### verb

To cut off unwanted parts.

'The flints are chipped, trimmed and sharpened, and then made into knives, spearheads and scrapers for cleaning animal skins.'

noun

The point of a spear.

'The flints are chipped, trimmed and sharpened, and then made into knives, spearheads and scrapers for cleaning animal skins.'

noun

Tools used for scraping off dirt or unwanted materials.

'The flints are chipped, trimmed and sharpened, and then made into knives, spearheads and scrapers for cleaning animal skins.'

## grindstone



noun

A thick disc of stone used for sharpening and grinding/crushing and smoothing materials.

'Sharpening it on a grindstone.'

verb

Making a hole with something sharp.

'Piercing a hole.'

#### noun

Branched horns on the head of an adult deer which are made from bone.

'Tools are used to make wood, antlers and bones into bowls, spears and ornaments.'

#### noun

Things used to make something look more attractive, but usually have no purpose.

'Tools are used to make wood, antler and bones into bowls, spears and ornaments.'

## skinning



verb

To remove the skin from an animal, fruit or vegetable.

'Skinning a deer.'

Synonym:

peeling

verb

To cook using a grill.

'Grilling meat.'

## spiking





Using a sharp point to pierce or impale something.

'Then, suddenly, *swoosh!* their spears dropped down like lightening and came up again spiking wriggling fish.'

Synonym:

spearing skewering piercing page 18

determiner

More than two, but not many.

"At once several people grabbed their spears and followed him."

### crept

#### verb

Moving slowly and carefully to avoid being noticed or heard.

'Slowly, slowly, we crept forwards until we saw – a reindeer!'

Synonym:

snuck slinked tiptoed

### munching

#### verb

To eat something steadily and often I a way that can be heard.

'It was standing alone, munching the grass.'

Synonyms:
chomping chewing crunching

### signal



#### noun

A gesture, action or sound that is used to give an instruction.

'At a signal, the others ran towards it, yelling and throwing their spears.'

Synonym:

gesture sign

### mouth



#### verb

An opening or entrance to a hollow (having an empty space inside) structure.

'We walked a long way until we came to the mouth of a cave.'

### struck



verb

Hit forcibly to produce sparks or fire.

'Om struck flint stones together to make fire.'

## flickering



verb

Burning or shining unsteadily/shakily.

'In the <u>flickering</u> light of the torch they looked real, as if they were running all around us.'

Synonyms:

glimmering glinting

adjective

Extremely angry.



'It was a bear, a big furious cave bear!'

Synonym:

enraged infuriated fierce

#### noun

A person who studies human history and prehistory by finding and examining things that have been used, made and left behind.

'I am an archaeologist now (that's me in the glasses).'

Objects or events that indicate the occurrence or existence of someone or something.
