

This week we are looking at different bears from around the world again. Can you remember where in the world a polar bear is from?



Today we are going to look at a country called Australia. Where is this on a map?

Australia is very different from England. It is much bigger, much hotter and has very different animals. It is in the South of the world. We are in the North.



Koala

Koalas are found in the **wild** in Australia. Although they are called 'koala bears' they are not bears. They are actually **marsupials**, like wombats, possums and kangaroos. This means they have a pouch to carry their babies, just like a kangaroo.

A baby koala is called a **joey**.

Joeys live in their mother's pouch for about six months.



Koala

Koalas like to eat eucalyptus leaves.

They have very sharp claws which they use to climb trees.

Koalas have large noses which are either pink or black.







Koala

Koalas are good at climbing trees. They use the sharp claws on their front paws to hold on to the branches and to grip their food.

They are **herbivores** and their favourite tasty treats are eucalyptus leaves.



Did You Know? Koalas can sleep for up to 18 hours a day.
