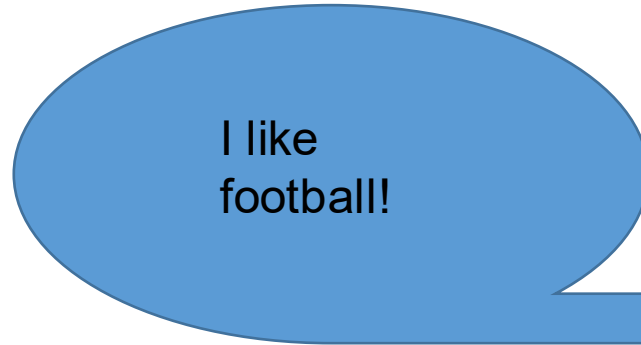
Underline the direct speech. One is done for you.

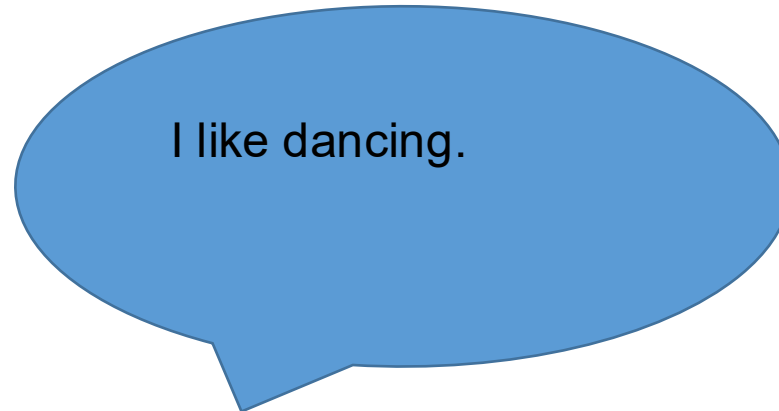
