

ENGLISH

This half term we will be looking at the book 'Winter's Child'. We will be using the illustrations to describe settings, we will be writing diary entries as the characters and we will also be writing our own stories set in a cold place.

We will also be reading non-fiction texts about polar animals and explorers!

PSHE

We will be focusing on the theme: 'Keeping Healthy, Keeping safe' we will be talking about risks both online and in the real world and how to manage them. We will be thinking about mental and physical health.

MATHS

This half term we will revise multiplication and division. We will learn about statistics, geometry (properties of shapes) and we will cover fractions.

We will continue to practise our 2x, 5x and 10x table to develop our instant recall and fluency with number facts.

Polar Explorers!

SCIENCE

This half term we will be looking at Materials and their uses, we will be thinking about the types of materials used by a polar explorer.

We will also continue to look at animals and their habitats, thinking about how animals have adapted to survive in cold places.

Geography/ History

We will be locating polar regions on a map and discussing the climate and the animals that live there. We will also be discussing global warming and what we can do to protect the polar regions. We will also be learning about famous polar explorers from the past and present.

RE

In RE we are learning about Judaism. We will also be thinking about Easter and why it is a special time for Christians.

ICT

We will be researching facts about polar regions on the ipads and chrome books.

REMOTE LEARNING

As we are currently in lockdown and learning remotely we will adapt our usual coverage to be accessible in a remote environment. Any areas of the curriculum not covered remotely will be of priority when we return to school.

ART /DESIGN / MUSIC

We will use watercolours to paint an arctic landscape, we will design our own eco-bags to reduce the use of plastic.

We will design and make our own flags to put on the North Pole!
