Definition: to move from one place to another.

Same word family: Immigrate: to move to another country to live there.





In the winter, some birds <u>migrate</u> to a warmer place.

The Celts migrated across Europe.

Definition: to make or shape a metal object by heating and hammering it.





The Celts would forge weapons out of iron.

Definition: a rapid surprise attack, especially to take something.





The Celts were known to <u>raid</u> each other's settlements.

The police <u>raided</u> a house the other day.

Eg. The Celts would <u>raid</u> other villages for food and weapons.

Definitions:

- 1) easily found.
- 2) shared with others.

Antonyms: rare, special





Iron was a <u>common</u> metal that was readily available.

We expect you to be able to spell all of the <u>common</u> words from Year 2.

Eg. Red is the most common colour of car.

Definition: The gift of something to a god as an act of worship.





Evidence of animal <u>sacrifice</u> during the Iron Age has been found.

Parents make big <u>sacrifices</u> for their children; especially giving up sleep.

Eg. <u>Sacrifices</u> were a part of many early religions.
