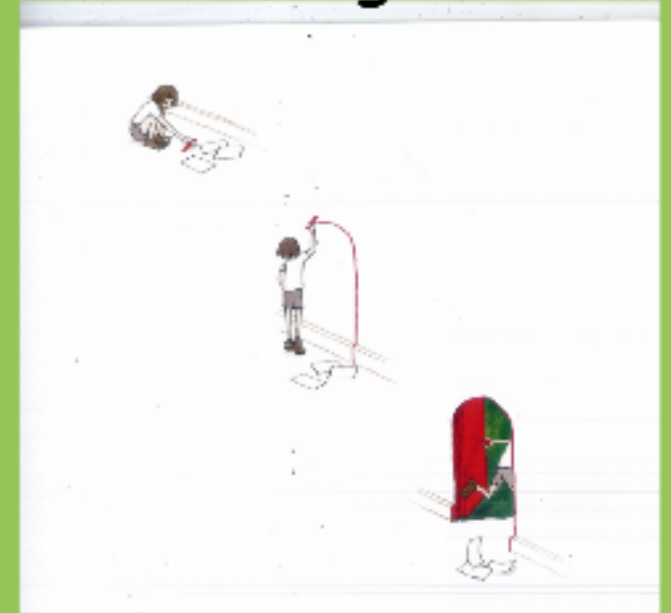
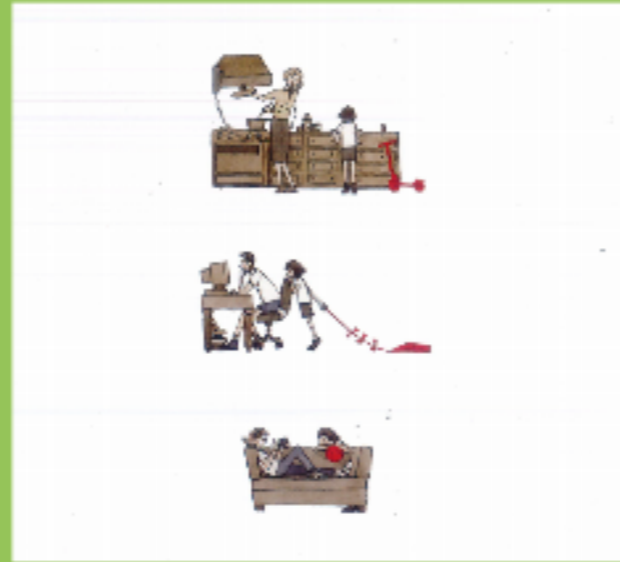

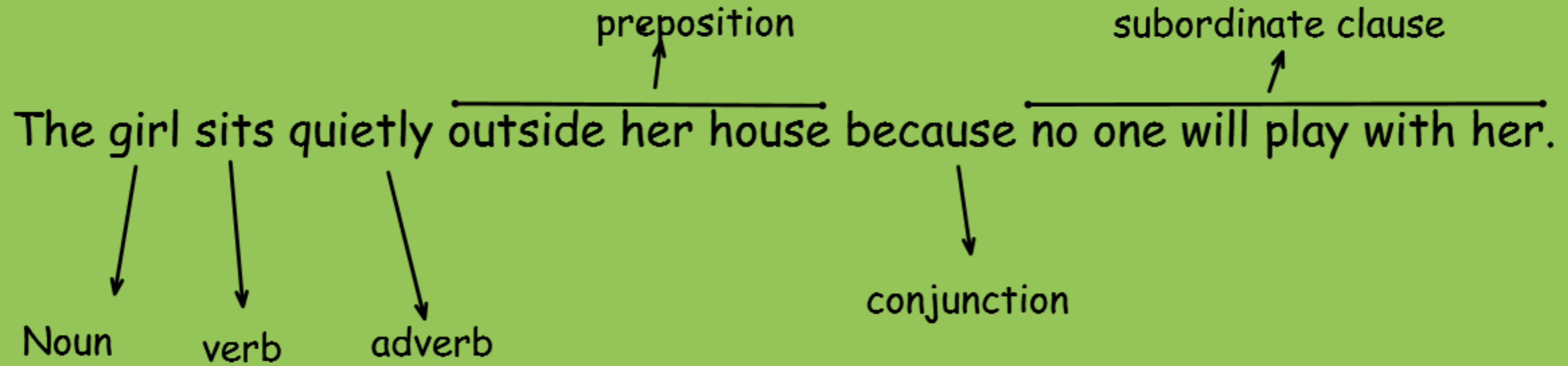

The girl sits quietly **outside her house** because no one will play with her.

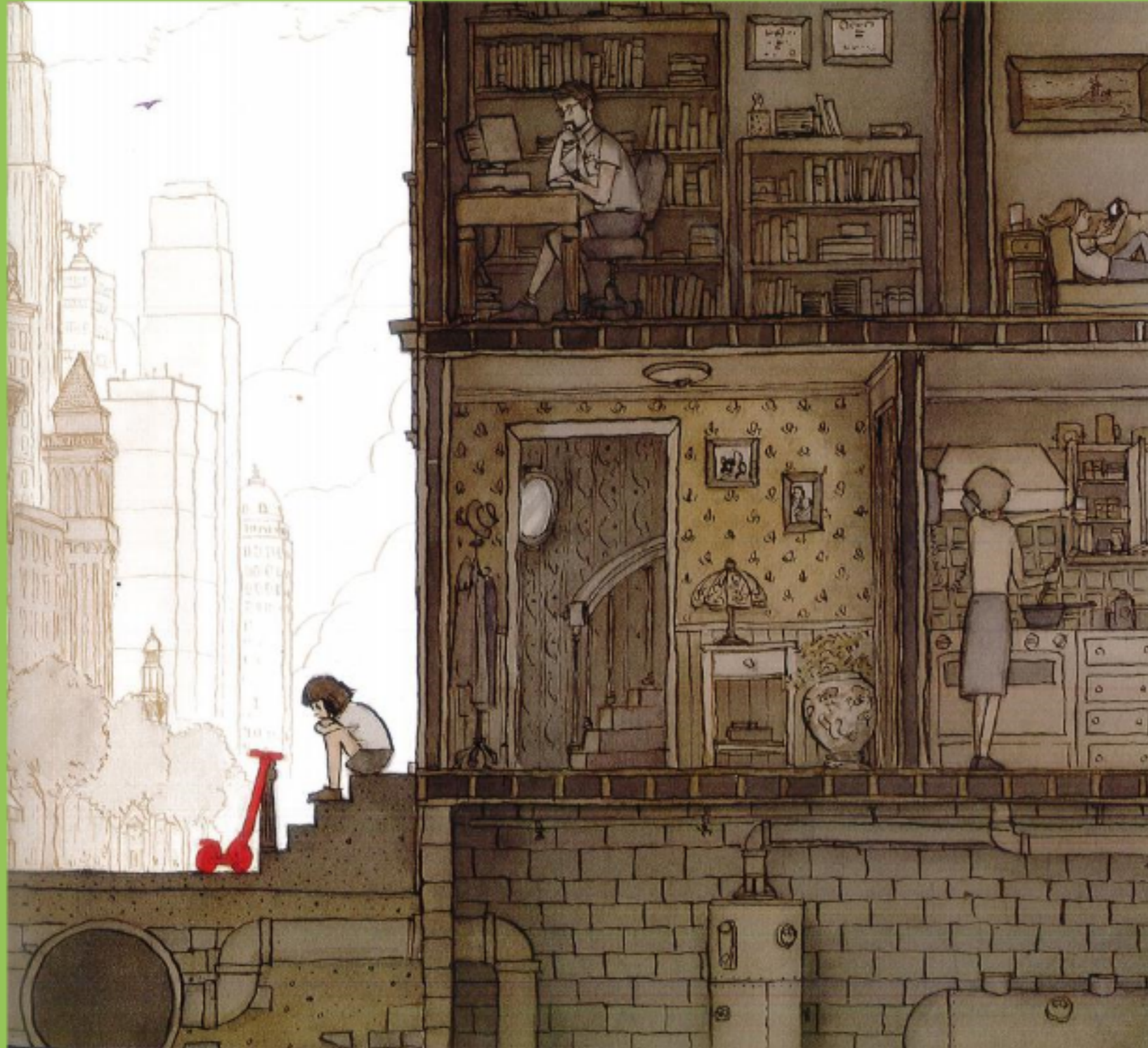


Lets keep the conjunction the same here but change the subordinate clause.

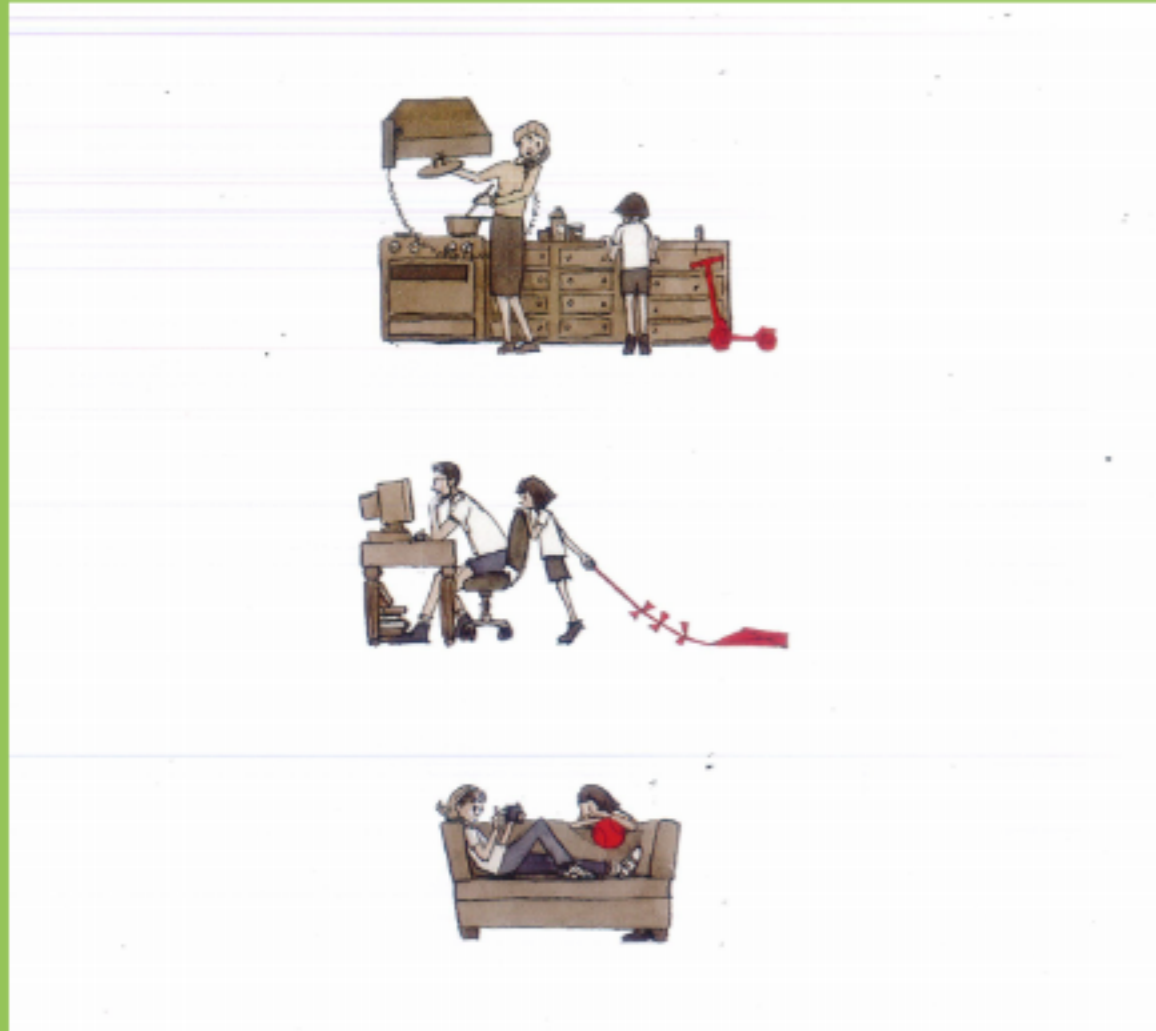

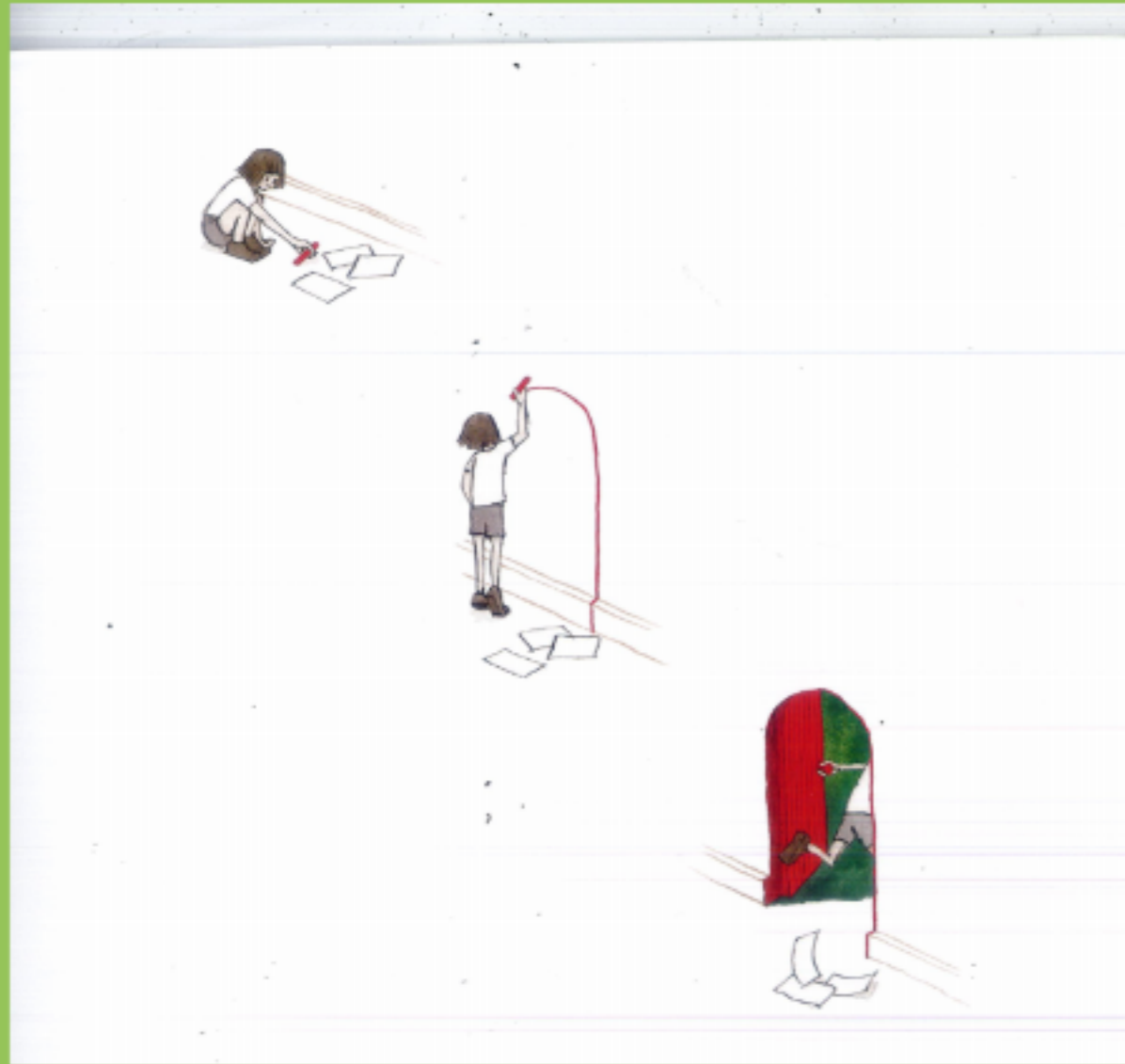

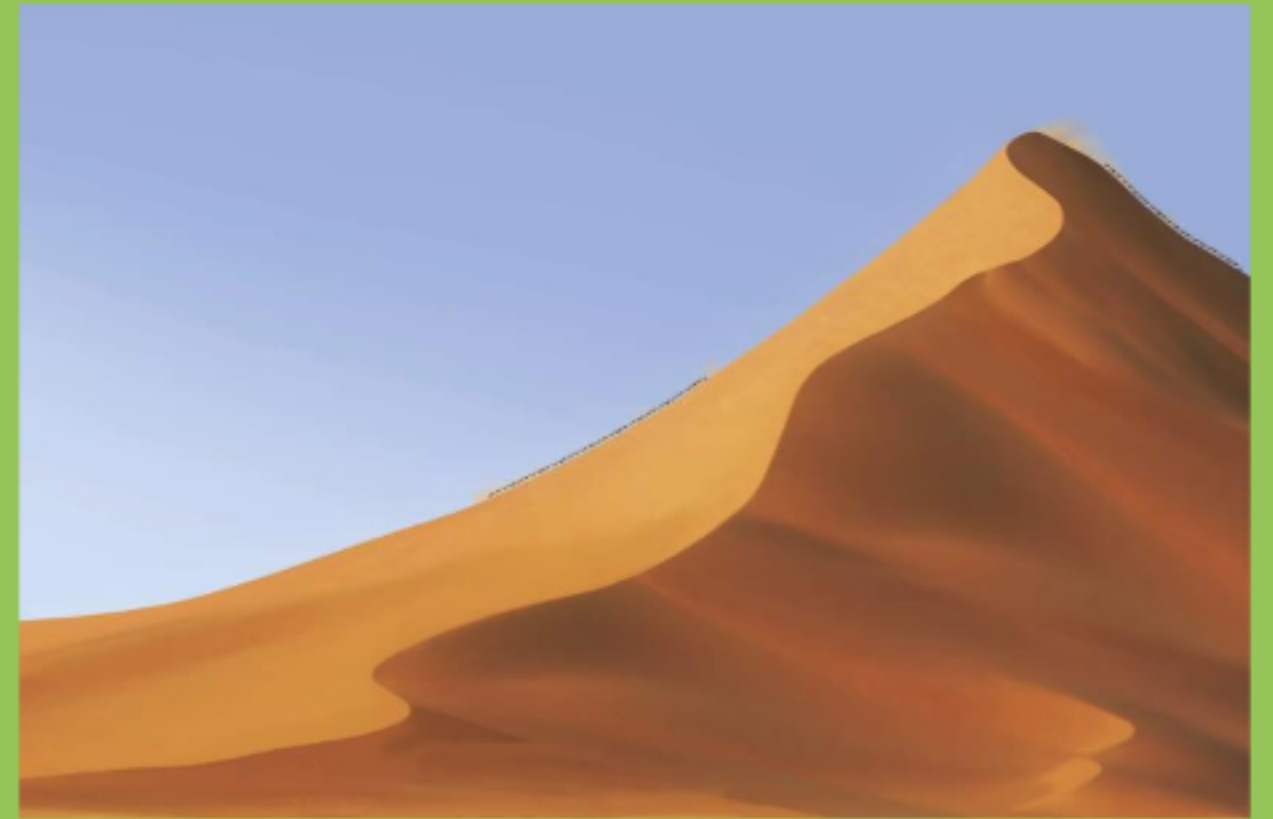


Instead of a forest my door opens into a desert.



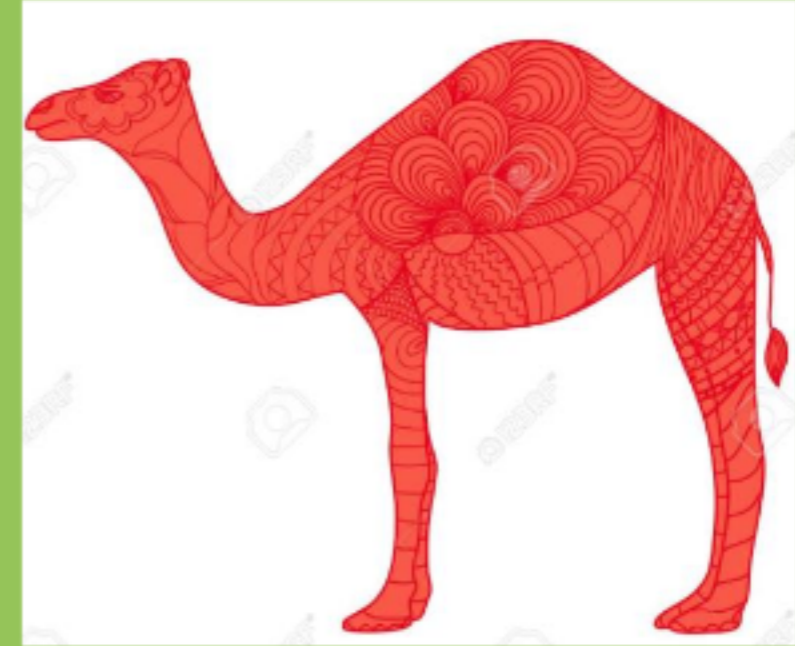
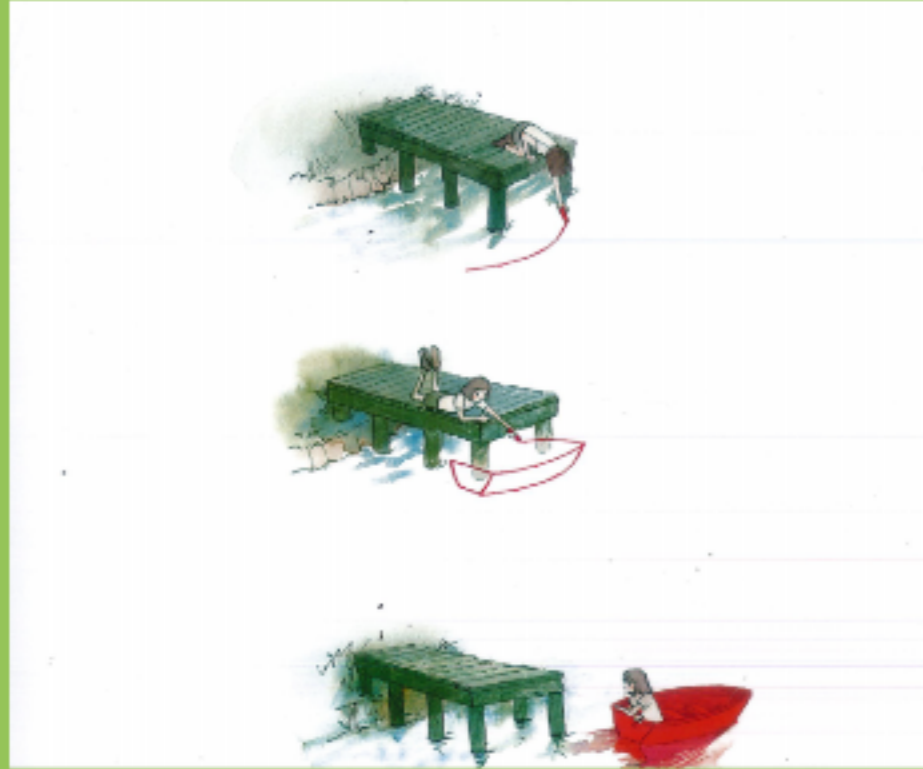
What would she see in the desert?
